



Annual report of the Trustees 2018/2019

The Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund is now in its 23rd year. The Trust benefits an area of approximately 10 miles from the Airport. Six Trustees are drawn from the Manchester Airport Consultative Committee to represent the City/Borough Council areas within the boundary:

In 2018/2019 75 grants have been awarded, amounting to £129,852 invested in community, environmental or social projects.



Marple Bridge Association received £3000 towards new staging for community events.

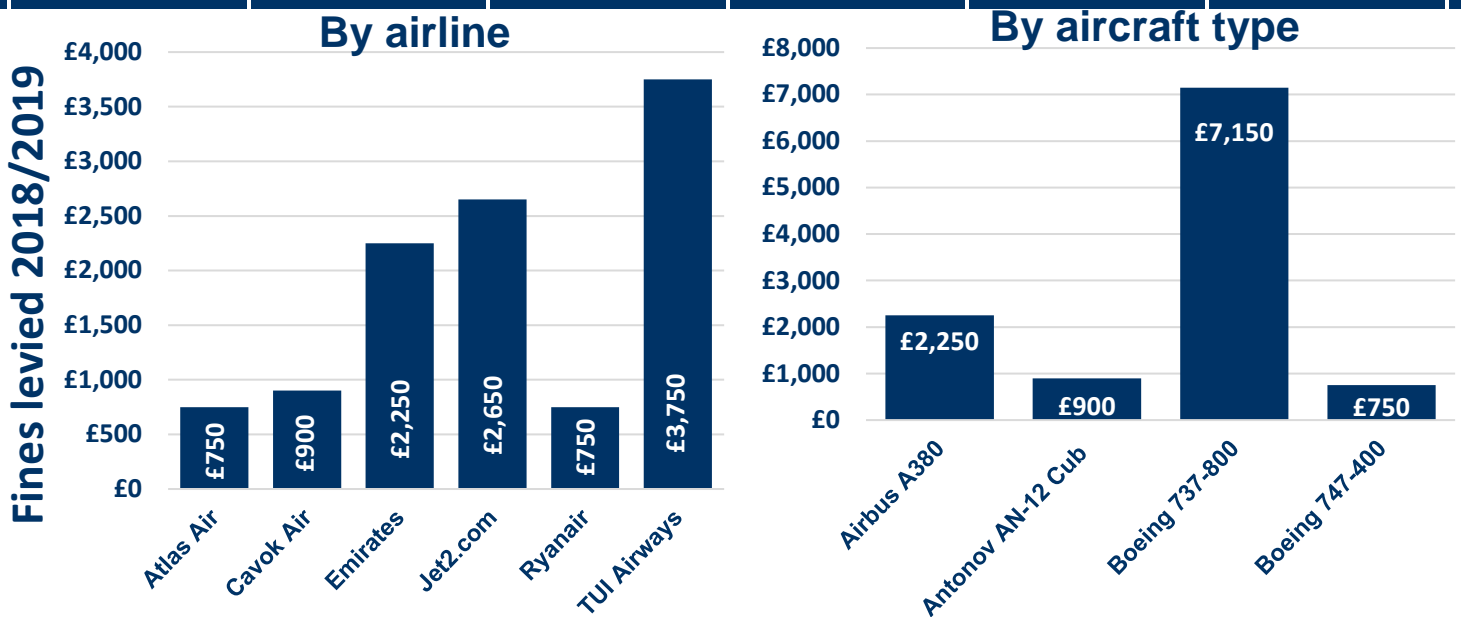


Where the money comes from:

The Community Trust Fund's income is an annual £100,000 donation from Manchester Airports Group and noise fines imposed on the airlines of departing aircraft that breach noise levels.

To encourage the quietest operations, the threshold for fining aircraft has fallen over the years. Modern aircraft are significantly quieter than their predecessors which has made this change possible. The daytime limit is 2dB less than when the Fund came in to being (in 1997) and the core night noise limit is 6dB more stringent. The table below lists our noise penalty limits.

In total £15,550 was raised through noise penalties and each year Manchester Airports Groups contributes a further £100,000. All Air Transport Movements related to Manchester Airport are monitored by the Manchester Airport Noise and Track Information System (MANTIS). The noise, path and compliance are measured, and penalties are levied, regardless of whether complaints are made. A public portal to MANTIS is provided to allow people to investigate their own complaints, and find out how much noise was made by an individual departure:

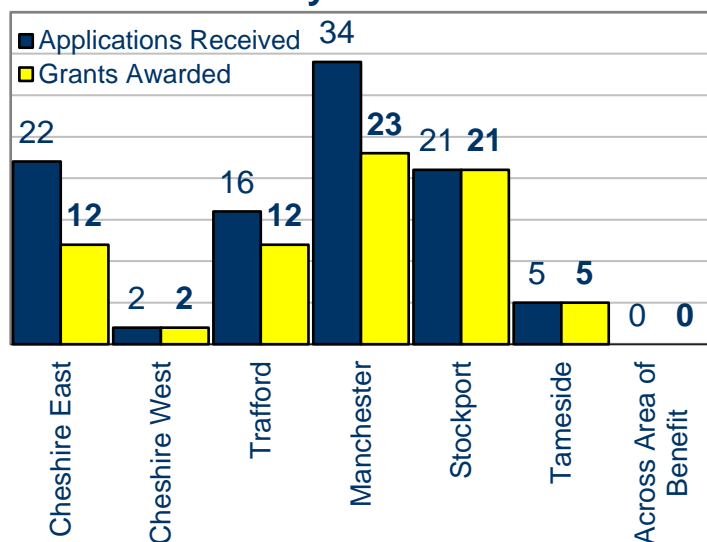

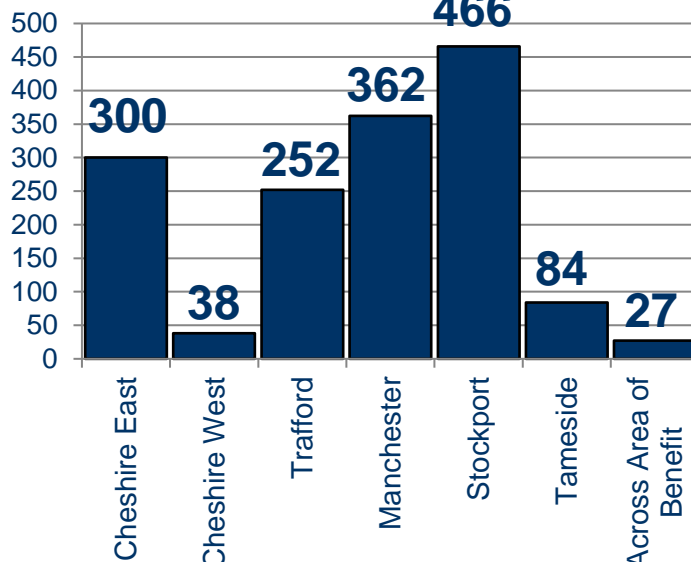
