

## RED ROUTING - AIRPORT ESTATE ROADS

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The safety of people working and visiting the airport site is our number one priority. Across the Pegasus Business Park 8000 people work in over 80 businesses and thousands of passengers arrive and depart each day from the airport. Everyone who comes to the airport, needs to be safe.

Controlling traffic flow on the roads throughout the site is fundamental to ensuring people’s safety and enjoyment of visiting EMA. A major concern of ours is the number of vehicles that wait in undesignated parking areas when dropping off and collecting passengers. This is particularly problematic around the petrol station area and side roads leading to busy employment sites such as UPS and Royal Mail. Not only does this cause congestion, but the haphazard and often inconsiderate nature of parking is dangerous for drivers and pedestrians. Many large articulated lorries require easy access to businesses on site and pedestrians need to be able to navigate themselves between hotels, car parks, and the terminal, easily and safely.

We are taking steps to improve road safety across the site including designating all airport roads as enforceable ‘red-routes’ with lining and appropriate signage.

Work begins this week to install the signage and paint the markings on the road. Stopping on a red route will be an offence and anyone caught doing so will be fined. This will be monitored 24 hours a day.

We will be proactively communicating with neighbouring businesses, taxi companies and frequent fliers to make them aware of the steps we’re taking. We will also promote the various parking options to passengers and visitors to ensure that everyone visiting EMA is aware of the choices they have including one hour’s free parking in Long Stay 2.
