


STANSTED AIRPORT ENVIRONMENT AND ENERGY POLICY

Stansted Airport is committed to be the pioneer of next generation journeys by continually improving our environmental and energy performance, preventing pollution, protecting the environment, reducing carbon emissions and complying with all environmental legal and other requirements. To achieve this we will:

1. Demonstrate strong leadership and governance through our Risk Management Processes. We will consider environmental protection and energy efficiency in our operational and investment decision making, taking account of how the environment affects our operation.
2. Define, implement and maintain our environment and energy management systems in line with the requirements of environmental legislation, ISO14001, ISO50001 and the Carbon Trust Standard.
3. Ensure the availability of information and necessary resources are available and assign clear responsibilities to deliver on our environment and energy commitments, targets and objectives.
4. Assess the impact on the environment and energy consumption of all activities at the airport and set objectives and targets to drive continual improvement performance.
5. Develop and implement environmental and energy strategies and programmes to deliver on this policy.
6. Define clear environment and energy performance standards and implement suitable controls for our own operations and for business partners, suppliers and contractors.
7. Embed environment and energy standards into our maintenance and facilities management processes.
8. Work with our stakeholders and other interested parties to deliver best practice environmental and energy management across the airport.
9. Design environmental protection and energy efficiency into new build and refurbishment projects, purchase energy efficient products and services wherever possible and consider the whole life cycle impacts of the products and services.
10. Provide information and training on environment and energy management, compliance and energy efficiency to relevant employees, business partners and suppliers.
11. Monitor and measure our environmental and energy performance and undertake audits to ensure compliance with legislation, this policy and our systems and processes.
12. Publically report on our environmental and energy performance each year through our corporate sustainability reporting programme.
13. Review this policy and the effectiveness of our management systems on at least annual basis as part of our management review process.
