

## Pedestrian Safety at EMA

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During the past few month's vehicle movement around the EMA roadways has been, due to COVID-19 controls, much less than normal.

Now that flights have resumed vehicle movement is on the increase and there have been several near misses between pedestrians and vehicles.

Please remember the following when walking around the EMA estate:

1. Always use the footpath or grass verge, do not walk on the road.
2. Do not cut corners and take short cuts, walk to the pedestrian crossing, and do not walk on the road to get to it.
3. Follow pedestrian walkway signs, do not walk across the road to save a few seconds.
4. When using pedestrian crossings, wait and look both ways to confirm its safe to cross before doing so.
5. When using a Pelican crossing (one with traffic lights) press the button and wait for the green walk light to show before crossing.

Please remember the following when driving around the EMA estate:

1. Always observe the speed limits.
2. Be observant of pedestrians.
3. Keep a safe distance from other vehicles (the driver in front of you may be unfamiliar with EMA).
4. Do not park on any double red lines. This poses a risk both to the safety of passengers and that of other road users, as well as causing congestion and disruption to traffic. Unauthorised vehicles found to be parking on double red lines may be fined.
